

Emergency Supplies



Tools & Materials

- ✦ Duct tape & scissors
- ✦ Multi-tool
- ✦ Sturdy knife
- ✦ Pry bar
- ✦ Shovel
- ✦ Shut-off wrench
- ✦ Pliers & Screw drivers
- ✦ Work gloves
- ✦ Rope & twine
- ✦ Plastic sheeting



Clothing

- ✦ Complete change of clothes & footwear for each person
- ✦ Sturdy work shoes or boots
- ✦ Extra sox & underwear
- ✦ Weather appropriate outer-wear & rain gear
- ✦ Gloves & hat
- ✦ Sunglasses



Emergency Items

- ✦ Radio – battery-powered, portable & extra batteries
- ✦ Flashlight & extra batteries
- ✦ First aid kit
- ✦ Cash
- ✦ Signal flare
- ✦ Compass
- ✦ Whistle
- ✦ Dust masks
- ✦ Travel alarm clock & batteries
- ✦ Matches in waterproof container
- ✦ Tent &/or tarp
- ✦ A-B-C fire extinguisher
- ✦ Paper & pencil
- ✦ Needles & thread



Bedding

- ✦ Blankets or sleeping bag for each person
- ✦ Pillows

Sanitation

- ✦ Washcloths & towels
- ✦ Towelettes, soap, hand sanitizer, liquid detergent
- ✦ Tooth paste, toothbrushes, shampoo, deodorants, shaving supplies, comb, brush
- ✦ Contact lens solutions
- ✦ Mirror
- ✦ Feminine supplies
- ✦ Sunscreen, insect repellent, lip balm
- ✦ Heavy-duty plastic garbage bags & ties
- ✦ Toilet paper, paper towels
- ✦ Disinfectant
- ✦ Household chlorine bleach* & eye-dropper
- ✦ Medium-sized plastic bucket with tight lid (maybe two)

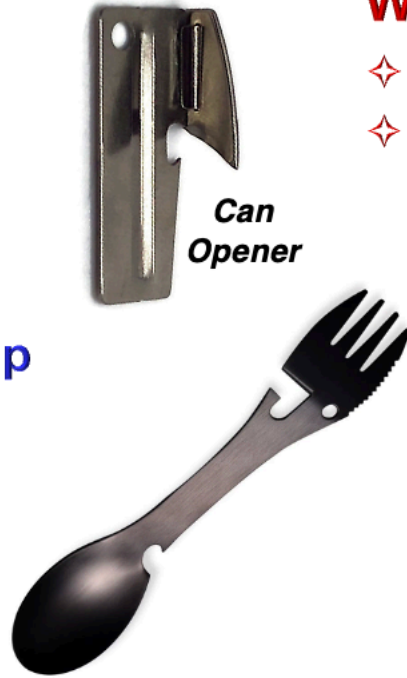
* **Chlorine Bleach** – When diluted nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners

Emergency Supplies



Kitchen

- ✦ Manual can opener
- ✦ Mess kit &/or paper cups, plates, plastic utensils
- ✦ All-purpose knife
- ✦ Sugar, salt, pepper
- ✦ Aluminum foil & plastic wrap
- ✦ Re-sealing plastic bags
- ✦ Small cooking stove & fuel



Water & Food

- ✦ Water for 7 – 10 days (1 gal per person per day)*
- ✦ Food: non-perishable for 7 – 10 days
 - ✦ Ready-to-eat meats
 - ✦ Canned fruits & vegetables
 - ✦ Canned or boxed juices
 - ✦ Boxed milk
 - ✦ Powdered milk
 - ✦ Canned soup
 - ✦ Peanut butter & jelly
 - ✦ Granola/protein bars
 - ✦ Trail mix
 - ✦ Vitamins
 - ✦ Tea & instant coffee
 - ✦ Cereal
 - ✦ Cookies & hard candy
 - ✦ Food for infants & people with special diets
 - ✦ Pet foods for 7 – 10 days

* **Chlorine Bleach** – When diluted nine parts water to one part bleach, bleach can be used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or bleaches with added cleaners
